i. HEALTH CARE INITIATIVE

Our aim is to provide quality health care and save lives through financial aid, nutrition, medical camps and equipping rural hospitals with medical diagnostic equipments.

Major Focus

- Financial support for cancer patients' treatment
- Cancer screening and awareness camps
- Nutritional kits and start-up kits for cancer patients
- Donation of medical diagnostic equipment to rural hospitals

Impact April 2024- March2025

- 230 + cancer patients were supported with their treatment
- 1,498 + patients were screened during our cancer screening camps
- 25000 + individuals were impacted through our Cancer awareness programmes
- 2,307+ nutritional kits and Start-up kits were distributed to cancer patients.
- 25 + workshop was conducted at the OPD department in Tata Memorial Hospital for paediatric Cancer patients.

ii. EDUCATION INITIATIVE

We believe in empowering our educated youth for the future, striving to unlock every child's full potential. When students are provided with equal opportunities to learn and study, they not only enhance their chances of success in higher education but also uplift the socio-economic status of their families.

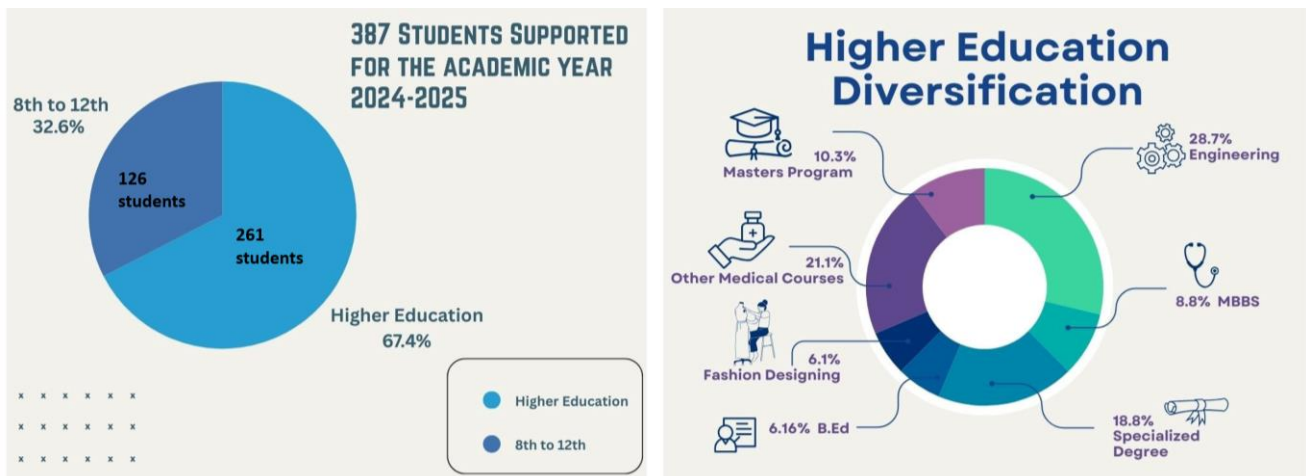

i. EVENTS

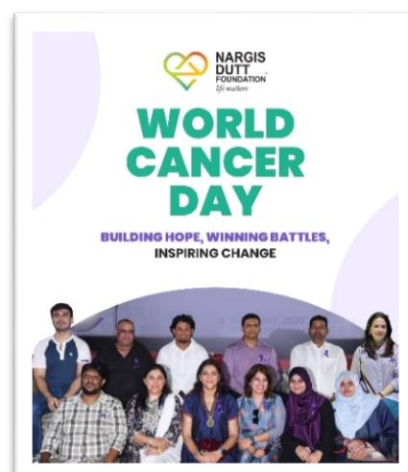
b) Scholarship Certificate Distribution

On 6th June, 2024, on the occasion of Shri Sunil Dutts birthday, NDF organised a program to interact with all of scholarship students and distributed scholarship certificates and school kits. The school kits were sponsored by Hasbro India.



c) World Cancer Day

On 4th February, 2024, NDF successfully hosted a World Cancer Day event at Carter Road Amphitheatre, graced by honourable doctors such as Dr. Anil D’cruz, Dr. Sewanti Limaye and Dr. Sampada Dessai and courageous cancer warriors who shared their inspiring journeys and insights, making it a truly impactful gathering.



d) Global Day of Joy

On 13th December, 2024, Team NDF Joined in Team Hasbro's annual event - Global Day of Joy, we brought smiles and hope to the students of Zilla Parishad School in Bori Chapada. With games, gifts, and celebrations, together we created moments of happiness and gave the children tools to dream, learn, and grow.



e) Cancer Awareness Programme in Collaboration with JEETO Foundation

Priya Dutt, along with cancer survivors walked the ramp at Mohali Club for a Cancer Awareness Programme. Notable attendees included Ms. Deep Shergill (Founder of JEETO Foundation), healthcare experts Dr. Vijay Bansal (Director of Surgical Oncology) and Dr. Meenakshi Mittal (Director of Radiation Oncology) of Ivy Hospital, and Mr. Mohan Bir Singh (Director of Paragon School).

The event highlighted the importance of cancer awareness as the initial step to overcoming the disease.

ii. SCHOOLS DEVELOPED DURING THE YEAR 2024-2025

a) Panchsheel Adivasi Ashram School in Bahiram-Karanja, Amravati, Maharashtra.

Computer Lab, E-learning, Concretization of the flooring, clean drinking water coolers, solar water heaters, and sanitary pad incinerators have been installed for 500 children at the Panchsheel Adivasi Ashram School in Bahiram-Karanja, Amravati, Maharashtra.

b) Borichapada Zilla Parishad School, Palghar

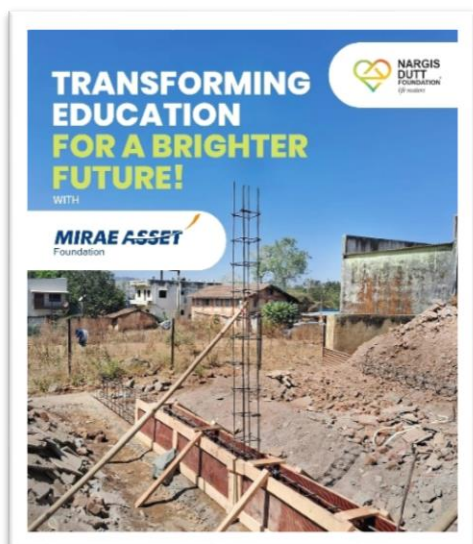
This initiative transformed the lives of 1600 students by providing essential sanitation facilities. Together, we helped create a healthier and safer learning environment for every child.

iii. Hospitals supported with medical diagnostic equipments during the year 2024-2025

a) Saidham Cancer Hospital, Shirdi

NDF donated essential ICU equipment to improve critical care.

Saidham Hospital, located in Rahuri and operated by the Dr. Mane Medical Foundation & Research Center, has been dedicated to charitable healthcare for years and has become a cornerstone of community health.



b) Cachar Cancer Hospital (Assam)

NDF, New York Chapter renovated the entire Operation Theatre (OT) for the smooth functioning of the OT. OT lights were also donated. Cachar Cancer Hospital is a charitable hospital located in rural Assam working with underserved and marginalized communities.



iv. Our Chapters in USA

Our Nargis Dutt Foundation - USA Chapter donated 44000\$ towards essential ICU equipment to improve critical care in the **Saidham Cancer Hospital in Shirdi**. NDFUSA is a 501c3 non profit tax deductible organization based in California.

Our Nargis Dutt Foundation New York Chapter donated 50000\$ for renovating the entire Operation Theatre (OT) in the **Cachar Cancer Hospital & Research Centre, Silchar, Assam** for its smooth functioning. OT lights were also donated.

v. Cancer Support Programs

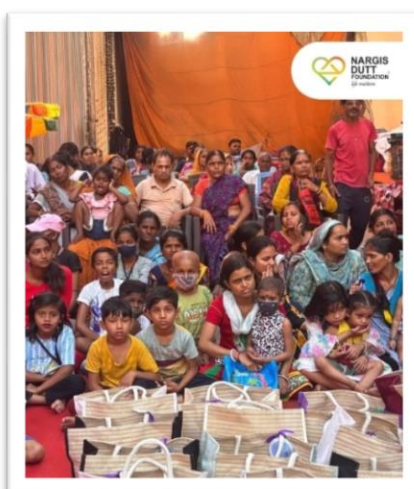
a) Paediatric Nutrition Kits for cancer patients

Every month, NDF in collaboration with different organizations and generous donors like Inner Wheel Club of Bombay Pier, Mrs Sharifa Khatri, our internship students and Hasbro India distributed paediatric nutritional kits for cancer patients at Tata Memorial Hospital.



b) Start-up Kits distribution

In partnership with Brenntag India, NDF distributed 300 start-up kits and 60 school kits to underprivileged cancer patients residing at the Sant Gadge Maharaj Dharmshala Trust.



c) Christmas Dinner at Borges Cancer Home

The true essence of Christmas lies in creating moments of comfort and joy for those who need it most. At Borges home, Bandra, we served special dinner to 430 cancer patients and their relatives, made possible by the support of generous donor, act of compassion like these unite us, reminding us of the incredible strength that comes from community, together, we make the season truly magical.



d) Health and Cancer Screening Camp at Khar (W)

On March 7, 2025, the Nargis Dutt Foundation organized a cancer screening and medical camp, providing essential check-ups and free medications. The services offered included CBC blood tests, HGT and BP check-ups, head and neck examinations, bone mineral density assessments, PSA tests, PFT tests for asthma and COPD, physician evaluations, PAP smear tests, cancer screenings by oncologists, gynaecological assessments, and surgical examinations.

We were privileged to have the Consulate General of Belgium, along with the Wallonia Trade and Investment (AWEX) team from Mumbai, and EONIX CEO Aloys Du Bois d'Aische visit the camp to witness the operation of a medical camp firsthand.



vi. Internship Programme

Students get the opportunity to intern with the foundation for a month and choose the cause they wish to support in health or education. These internships give students the opportunity to work real time and understand the functioning of a NGO, be empathic to the cause and make a direct impact on society.

At the end of the internship, students are awarded with internship letters and certificates.

In the year 2024-2025, approximately 50 students from NMIMS college interned with our foundation.

Each internship involved visits to Tata Memorial Hospital, visits to Sant Gadge Maharaj Dharmshala Trust to conduct workshops, fundraising and designing project reports, reels and campaign pitches.



a) Participation in Public Service film

Nargis Dutt Foundation participated in the Guthli Ad Fest 2024, an initiative by Agency M, India's first-ever adfest. Students from across the country aged 15 to 23 participated in making a Public Service Film on Cancer Awareness. In addition to this, ad legends Piyush Pandey and K.V Sridhar, donated to support the education of six of our talented underprivileged students for 3 years.



b) Project AaroHi

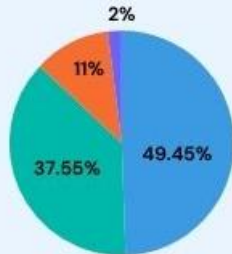

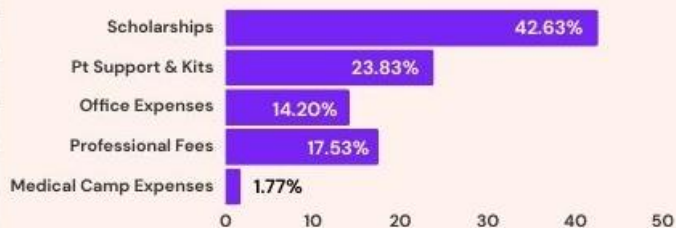
